### **NEWSLETTER – MARCH 2022**

### **WELCOME**

Welcome to the March edition of our Newsletter.

Remember the *Club Cocktail Party* on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> March from 5pm to 7pm.

Please come along and join the fun! Sports have been severely curtailed by the recent rains, so here is a chance to catch up with friends for a relaxing couple of hours.

We continue to do all that we can to maintain our Club as a safe place to be – the safety of our members, guests and staff will continue to be of the highest priority.

The Club has extended to 31<sup>st</sup> March the temporary By-law restricting entry to only those who are able to show proof that they are fully vaccinated or those with a registered Medical Contraindication Exemption.

Club Manager Kevin is now permitted to return to onsite work due to the fact that he has gained natural immunity to COVID 19, which has been confirmed by pathology reports and documented by the NSW Govt Contraindication Certificate issued by a doctor who is a Fellow of the Royal College of General Practitioners.

The Certificate is valid until 21<sup>st</sup> July 2022. The Board have been working on this matter with guidance from workplace relations, legal experts to ensure that we do not place the Club at any risk.

### The Road to Freedom

We made it! The NSW Government has finally lifted the last COVID-related restrictions on personal freedoms in hospitality venues such as ours.

I am personally glad to see the end of those pesky face masks. Of course, we can continue to wear face masks, but at least it will be our own personal choice, rather than an edict from above.

We should be congratulating ourselves on a truly remarkable achievement. The first cases of COVID-19 in Sydney occurred just over two years ago, on 19 January 2020, when three travellers returned from Wuhan, China and tested positive. During those two years, not a single case of COVID can be traced back to our Club.

This could not have happened without the full co-operation of all our members. Give yourself a well-deserved pat on the back. You have made our Club one of the safest places on the planet, safer than shopping malls, cafes etc. Even safer than some private homes.

Let us now move our lives along, with renewed optimism.



### COVID-19

The following restriction currently applies but changes may be imposed at any time.

Only fully vaccinated people or those holding the approved Medical Contraindication Exemption Certificate are allowed on Club premises up to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 (which date is subject to change at any time).

There is no longer any requirement to electronically check in with the QR code. There are also no longer any spacing rules, but your Club will continue to space furniture out in a safe and comfortable way.

Patrons are no longer required to wear face masks indoors but may continue to wear them as a matter of personal choice.

We still recommend use of hand sanitizer available throughout the Club. 1.5m spacing between people is still recommended, both indoors and outside.

Jacks, mats and croquet equipment should still be disinfected before and after each game. You should not handle other people's sports equipment.

Cards and mah-jong tiles along with associated items should be sanitised using wipes / sanitiser provided on tables.

As announced last month the WCC has been selected along with Chatswood, Cammeray, Eastwood and Manly Croquet Clubs to co-host some of the preliminary and plate rounds of the 2022 Australian Croquet Championships - Men's Singles Association Croquet. An International ranked tournament presented by Croquet Australia, and this year hosted by Croquet NSW, contested by some of Australia's best players.

This opportunity comes to Sydney once every 6 years, and we consider ourselves honored and privileged to be selected to co-host this prestigious event, although in a very small way with just one lawn to offer.

If you are looking for an outing with a difference or just something to do on Sunday the 13<sup>th</sup> or Monday the 14<sup>th</sup> March, pop into the club and watch a very traditional game of Association croquet played at the top level with skill, strategy and precision by the best of the best.





### Points of interest

For the 2022 Australian Championships the Lawn boundary marking, hoops and peg will be moved one meter to the east.

Our Green keepers, Darren and James have been asked to quicken the Lawn speed to 11 - 13 seconds. Maybe a difficult task if the current inclement weather conditions continue for the next 14 days.

Hoop gaps are to be reduced to 3.11/16 inches, there is a margin allowed of +/- 1/32 of an inch. Extremely tight when considering croquet balls are manufactured to a diamiater of 3.5/8 inches with a margin of +/- 1/32 of an inch. Yes you guess it. If the + margins are add and the hoop setting is not precise there is a possibility of a Ball jammed in a hoop. Rule 35(b) covers such a situation.



### How to build a retaining wall - the Warrawee way

- 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday


### The naming of C Green

### **GRANTS**

### FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

### HISTORY OF KU-RING-GAI COUNCL

The Darramuragal or Darug people have been in our area for thousands of years. They lived from Newcastle to Sydney, mostly along the waterways.

Eleven weeks after the First Fleet arrived, Governor Phillip set off to find water sources and farming land. On 16th April 1788 the expedition camped at Middle Harbour creek – becoming the first Europeans to set foot in what is now Ku-ring-gai.

One of the first white settlers to live in the area was William Henry who farmed the land next to the Lane Cove River in 1814. The early population consisted of workers and farmers who lived in small, isolated communities.

The population grew in the mid-1800s as major transport routes were built. The construction of the railway in 1890 and the introduction of local government transformed the region from a series of isolated farming communities into a collection of sought after suburbs.

The formation of the Council closely paralleled the history of our Club.

The **Shire of Ku-ring-gai** was incorporated on 6 March 1906 and the first Council election was held on 24 November 1906, with the result being declared on 8 December. The first President of the Shire was William Cowan.



Only months later, on 1 April 1907, the **Ku-ring-gai Recreation Club** conducted its *Foundation Day*, on our present site, later becoming **Warrawee Bowling Club**.

The first Shire Council consisted of 6 councillors and a small building was constructed on the main road in Gordon, replacing temporary offices that had been constructed on the grounds that later became St John's Church.

The inter-war period saw vast improvements in infrastructure and a period of urban consolidation and local government needed to expand. In 1928, the **Shire** was converted into **Ku-ring-gai Municipal Council** with 4 wards, each represented by 3 aldermen.

[ASIDE: Apparently at the time, it was not contemplated that women would seek to serve on Council. It was not until the 1960s that a woman would eventiually become an "Alderman" of Kuring-gai Council. The title was later changed to "Councillor". How things have changed! The 21<sup>st</sup> century has seen 5 female Mayors of Ku-ring-gai, some serving more than one term – Laura Bennett 2000-02 - Adrienne Ryan 2004-05 - Elaine Malicki 2005-06, 2008-10, 2012-13 – Jennifer Anniston 2011-12, 2013-15, 2015-21 – Cheryl Szatow 2015-16. A total of 14 years out of 22. Jennifer Anderson is the longest serving Major of either gender, in the 116 year history of the Council]

The original section of the present Council Chambers (below) was opened in 1928.

By that time, the main road had been named Lane Cove Road, later to become the Pacific Highway.

The last **President** of the **Shire** was George Christie and the **Vice President** was William Read. These gentlemen became the first **Mayor** and **Deputy Mayor** respectively, of **Ku-ring-gai Municipal Council** in 1928.


After serving on the Council, both gentlemen went on to bigger and better things.

William Read became President of Warrawee Bowling Club from 1938 to 1941.

George Christie became President of Warrawee Bowling Club from 1944 to 1947.

During World War II, Ku-ring-gai hosted major Australian defence agencies and bases and a number of community organisations formed to help the war effort. Among them were the Ku-ring-gai Women War Workers, who supplied knitted goods to soldiers fighting abroad and the Ku-ring-gai Voluntary Aid Detachments, who cared for sick and wounded soldiers upon their return to Australia.

Some time later, in 1979-1980, former Club member **Howard Vains** was also Mayor of Ku-ring-gai.

Howard was living in Wahroonga at the time but has since down-sized to an apartment in Cremorne. He is currently a member of Mosman Bowling Club.

Below a comprehensive list of Mayors, and Deputy Mayors. I do not have comprehensive lists of Club members, especially from the early days. If anybody knows of other Warrawee Bowling Club members who have served on Council, I would be pleased to hear of them.

### INHERENT STRENGTH REMAINS IN LOCAL PROPERTY MARKET

As we moved into February it became apparent that there is still plenty of strength and optimism within our market, with a solid pool of upbeat buyers looking to purchase. And while we would never expect to replicate the heady price expansion that we saw in last year's unparalleled climate, the market is definitely still propelling forward, albeit with more moderate growth.
